Dear Mayor Grace,

The 2009 Annual Report of the Elyria Police Department is respectfully submitted for your review. This report is based strictly on the NIBRS format for reporting crime data. It contains no Uniform Crime Report defined data. The total calls for service in 2009 were 42,547. Total calls for service equal the number of incidents officers responded to, 36,747, along with the number of officer initiated calls, 5,800, to equal total calls for service of 42,547. This is the first year we have combined the two types of calls. The reason for combining the two types of calls is that it more accurately portrays what officers of the Elyria Police Department handle during the year. From this point on, each annual report will show the total calls for service to include incidents and officer-initiated calls. Serious crimes in the City of Elyria increased by 1% in 2009 over the previous year. During 2009, reports showed a decrease in juvenile arrests of 16 % and a 15 % decrease in adult arrests. The number of traffic arrests was down for the year showing a decrease of 19 % from 2008.

The police department took a substantial decrease to the budget from the year 2008. We started 2009 with 86 sworn officers, 45 full-time civilian employees, and 57 part-time employees. We ended the year 2009 with 85 sworn officers and a total of 17 full-time civilian employees. The city laid off 28 full-time police civilian employees, all 57 part-time police civilian employees, was forced to close the city jail, and transferred the crossing guards from the police department to the Elyria City Schools. Captain Hood retired in September 2009 and Chief Medders used vacation time starting on December 18, 2009 until his retirement in February of 2010. Their retirements reduced the command staff from the Chief and three Captains to two Captains, one of which was the Acting Chief. Patrolman Ray Dietsche resigned to take a position as patrolman with the Avon Police department. Patrolman Tom Orsik was deployed for at least a year starting in December 2009. I would like to restate that the national average for officers per 1000 citizens is 2.3 officers. That would indicate that Elyria Police Department's staffing should be at 128 officers. According to the city charter, the authorized strength of the police department is 102 officers.

The high number of layoffs, the jail closing, and the constant threat of more layoffs in the future made for a very stressful situation; however, the employees did an outstanding job throughout the year. Unfortunately, the 2010 budget does not look any better. The police department is in serious need of personnel, equipment, and training. I look forward to working with you and City Council to try to correct the deficiencies in the department.

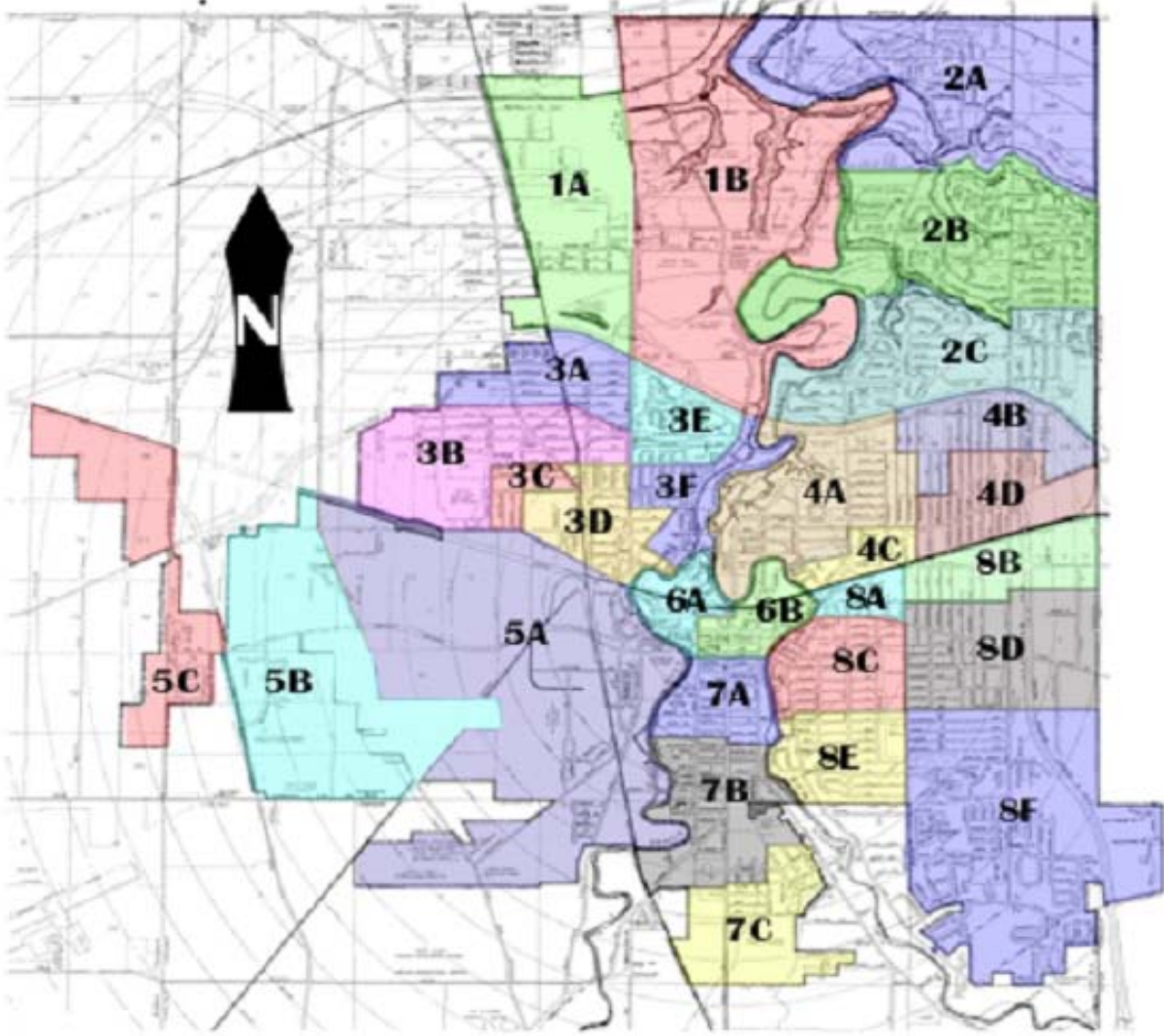

Special Response Team - SRT

2009

The Elyria Police Department Special Response Team was not called upon for any critical incidents in 2009 and was not utilized to serve any search warrants during the year.

In 2009, the Special Response Team conducted all mandatory training to maintain proficiency in the methods and tactics used by the team and its members. All Special Response Team members complete the mandatory physical fitness test to remain in good standing with the team.

The Special Response Team trains twelve times per year. This training includes, but is not limited to firearms, victim rescue, barricaded suspects/hostage situations, building entries, dignitary protection, vehicle assaults, repelling, and active shooter training. Officers on the Special Response Team are also required to pass a stringent physical fitness test four times per year to remain an active member of the team. The test consists of a three-mile run, pull-ups, push-ups, sit-ups, and a bench press.

K9 Unit 2009

The Elyria Police K9 unit was created after a generous donation from Sue Everett, owner of Dynatech Systems Inc. on Resar Ct. in Elyria. Sue, being a devoted pet owner and a friend of the police department, saw a need at the Elyria P.D. She also saw a way for her to give back to the community that she is an everyday part of by donating the money for two K9's and their training.

The first K9 that was placed on the streets of Elyria was K9 Stuka in October of 2006. He has since been followed by K9 Foky in February of 2008. The K9 unit adds another tool for the police to combat and prevent crime in an around the City of Elyria.

The K9's are each paired, trained and certified with a Handler/Officer. The Officer and K9 are commonly referred to as a team. The K9 teams are used for narcotic detection, tracking, building searches, area searches, warrant services, perimeter security, public appearances, and apprehensions of violent or fleeing subjects that would otherwise pose a risk to Officers. In addition to working in the City of Elyria the K9 units are available, and have been called to assist neighboring departments through a mutual aid agreement.

The K9 teams are certified every two years with the Ohio Peace Officers Training Academy. They also maintain their training with weekly documented training and evaluations.

Jail Operations

2009

Due to serious budget issues facing the City of Elyria in 2009, the Elyria City Jail was forced to close on October 2nd, 2009. As a result of this, 15 corrections officers were laid off. All prisoners are now held at the Lorain County Jail pending the posting of bond, or an appearance in court.

Prior to closing, there were 3,007 prisoners and pretrial detainees processed through the facility during 2009. This represents a decrease of 1,369 from the previous year.

Support Services Training

In 2009, many members of the Elyria Police Department received training in numerous law enforcement related subjects. This training was accomplished through the use of outside schools and seminars, roll-call training and in-service training. The following is a list of some of the topics covered:

During 2009, the Elyria Police Department provided tours of the police station to 200 juveniles and adults on a total of 21 organized tours. There were also 15 speaking engagements where presentations were provided to approximately 1,280 people.

Support Services

Safety Town

The 2009 Safety-Town was a cooperative effort of the City of Elyria, the Elyria Kiwanis Club, and the Fraternal Order of Police Associates and is conducted at Northwood Junior High School.

A total of 356 children received instruction during the Safety-Town Program in 2009. Since 1990, over 8,400 children have benefited from the Safety-Town Program. In general, personal safety, as well as safety going to, from and while at school is taught during the program.

There were 120 student volunteers who donated hours as Safety-Town instructors

Support Services

Adult Crossing Guard Program

Budget constraints forced the end of the Adult Crossing Guard Program at the conclusion of the school year in June 2009. Approximately 47 guards were affected by this change. The Elyria City Schools now manages this program.

Investigative Division

2009

During the year 2009, the Elyria Police Investigative Division investigated a wide range of crime. The Investigative Division was comprised of three different divisions, the Narcotics Unit, the Youth Bureau and the Detective Bureau. The Narcotics Unit primarily investigated crimes such as Possession of Drugs, Trafficking in Drugs, Prostitution and Gambling. The Youth Bureau primarily investigated felony crimes involving juveniles as suspects or victims, as well as missing persons. The Detective Bureau primarily investigated felony crimes involving adults as suspects or victims, as well as missing persons.

In 2009, there were two homicides. During these investigations crime scenes were processed, witnesses were identified and interviewed. These investigations lead to the arrest of a suspect in each case. These suspects now await trial. The Investigative division investigated 517 cases during 2009. 174 (33.6%) were cleared by arrest or indictment.

During 2009, the Elyria Police Department's Narcotics Unit was involved in numerous drug investigations. In 2009 the unit conducted 68 controlled drug buys. Some of these controlled drug buys led to the immediate arrest of the suspects. Many of these narcotics buys were considered for indictment by the Lorain County Grand Jury. Some of the buys were used in conjunction with on-going investigations into drug complaints and high drug trafficking areas. These investigations directly led to 8 search warrants. The Elyria Police Department Narcotics Unit assisted by the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) and the Lorain County Drug Task Force worked in a cooperative investigation into the higher echelons of the drug trafficking trade, interrupting a supply line of cocaine and marijuana from the Toledo Ohio area.

The Narcotics Unit also conducted investigations into the illegal sale of alcohol by two downtown businesses/clubs. These investigations led to the closure of these businesses/clubs. An adult entertainment business was investigated for liquor violations and under age dancing. As the result of that investigation this business was closed.

The Narcotics Unit assisted in locating and arresting the suspects in two homicides and two suspects in a felonious assault resulting from a gunfight. Three firearms investigations resulted in indictments in U.S. Federal Court.

The Narcotics Unit assisted the U.S. Marshal Service during Operation Falcon and were directly involved in the arrest of 44 suspects throughout Lorain County.

The Elyria Police Investigative Unit operates and maintains the Property/Evidence Room and is responsible for the return or disposition of abandon vehicles. During 2009, 5033 pieces of property/evidence were processed into the Property Evidence Room. Property/Evidence is then disposed of in accordance with law. 1144 vehicles were towed by the Elyria Police Department. 110 vehicles were not claimed by the owner. 84 were determined to be of little value and were destroyed, 72 from prior years. 13 were placed into service. 60 are pending disposition.

The Elyria Police Department Investigative Unit presented felony cases generated by the Patrol Division to the Lorain County Grand Jury.
